




AboutUs

- We conduct neuroscience and environmental research projects in Latin American communities
- Currently, we are working on a neuroscience research project that will study the effects of early life adversities in children from a vulnerable Venezuelan community in order to develop a local-led intervention that will aid in their neurodevelopment
- In our projects, we will focus on local-led development, an approach where we empower the leaders of these communities to make long-lasting, sustainable change
- In our future projects, we plan to bring clean energy and water to this community in Venezuela by building solar panels and water wells with a team of engineers and supporting animal conservation efforts.
- To finance these projects, we give monthly engineering, science, and art workshops at Florida elementary schools

Project #1: Children's Neurological Development

In this project, we will observe early-life adversities' effects on children's neurological and physical development by comparing different results of neuropsychological evaluations of children with varying degrees of early-life adversities. Our goal is for the results of this study to be later used to design a locally-led humanitarian project in these communities that will lead to long-lasting, sustainable change in the neurological and overall development of these children.

For this project, we plan to partner with Venezuelan engineers to install solar panels and build water wells, providing clean energy and water to families in a vulnerable Venezuelan community.






